#### Masks

All Staff and students are required to wear a mask that covers the nose and mouth with no gaps at all times during the school day, with the exception of teacher scheduled mask breaks:

- Face shields alone are not an acceptable face covering.
- Bandanas and neck gaitors are not considered acceptable face coverings.
- This includes when students are seated at their desks.
- The district will work with families whose children have a medical concern regarding wearing a mask (documentation is required).

This is based on current County, State, and CDC Guidance.

## Updates to plan - Since September 2020

- Pre-K moved to 5 days a week 9:00-12:00
- Students have been returning to in-person learning
  - CTF Students
  - Students with IEPs and 504's
  - Students (based on Teacher and Counselor recommendations)
- Using antimicrobial / disinfectant spray on buses and throughout school buildings
- Building air handlers increasing outside airflow by 50% in classrooms
- As of today, no positive cases within district staff / students
- Tents have been removed without an impact on programming

## Updates to plan - Since September 2020

- Attendance & Discipline rates
- Technology Enhancements
  - 295 Chromebooks have been ordered (and received)
  - 100 Cameras for classrooms
  - Network speed increased (doubled wifi capacity)
- Additional fabric masks for staff and students
- Number of virtual students has decreased district wide
- Social Emotional Support is strong
- People are attesting regularly

#### Concerns

- Issues around virtual learning
  - Attendance & Participation
  - Behavioral expectations at home in an online learning environment
- Physical Education
  - Weather
- Overall Academic Success
  - Maintaining high expectations while being in tune with student needs

#### Concerns

- Communication
  - Nursing
  - Teacher to Parents and vice versa
- Classroom Management / Cohort Model
  - Paraprofessionals and Teachers
- Sports and Extracurriculars
  - Under the direction of County and NYS
- Full remote learning (if directed by county DOH or NYS)

### Addressing Concerns

- Working to bring more students back to full in person learning
  - Utilize larger spaces district wide
- Consideration of 10th period / structured study halls
- Working to implement updated guidance as we receive it
- Professional development on virtual learning / hybrid learning
- PE will be spaced out throughout building in HS
- Students will engage in low-impact activities indoors
- More outdoor winter sport activities will be offered

## Frequently Asked Questions

A switch from remote to in-person or vice versa does not guarantee you the same teacher in the elementary school.

In person learners who do not attend in person are marked absent, but can make up the work (in Schoology and Google Classroom).
